## 2013- 2014 7<sup>TH</sup> Grade immunization Assessment Results California Department of Public Health, Immunization Branch

### Introduction

Under Assembly Bill 354 (2010), California Health and Safety Code Section 120335 required students in 7-12<sup>th</sup> grade during the 2011-2012 school year and 7<sup>th</sup> grade for future years to provide documentation of either having received a booster immunization against pertussis or an exemption to immunization. The pertussis booster immunization recommended for adolescents is known as 'Tdap'. This report summarizes the assessment of the 7<sup>th</sup> grade pertussis immunization (Tdap) requirement based on reporting from California schools. The attached tables present immunization rates by county and grade level.

#### <u>Methods</u>

Staff from 4,609 of California's schools with 7<sup>th</sup> graders submitted immunization assessment reports to local health departments and CDPH Immunization Branch. Students were considered to have completed the Tdap immunization requirement if they had received one dose of any immunization (Tdap, DTaP or DTP) that protects against pertussis on or after their 7<sup>th</sup> birthday.

#### Results




Figure 2: Percentage of California 7<sup>th</sup> Graders with a PME or PBE, 2011-12 to 2013-14 School Years




Figure 3: Percentage of California 7<sup>th</sup> Graders with a PME By School Type, 2011-12 to 2013-14 School Years

Table 1 summarizes the results from the 2013-14 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Pertussis (Tdap) assessment. Of 491,908 students enrolled in 2013-14 the 4,609 schools that reported, 491,908 (96.6%) completed the pertussis immunization (Tdap) requirement. There were 943 (0.19%) students with permanent medical exemptions (PMEs) 16,013 (3.26%) students with personal belief exemption (PBEs) during 2013-14. The percent of students that completed pertussis immunization (Tdap) decreased by about a half percent each year for the past three years (Figure 1). A slightly higher percentage of students in public schools completed the pertussis immunization (Tdap) requirement compared with private schools this year (Table 1) and for the past three years (Figure 1), with the gap widening each year. Students with PBEs increased by a half percentage each year over the past three years and at a faster rate over the past three years compared with students with PMEs (Figure 2). The percentage of students with PBEs in both public and private schools has increased at a similar rate over the past three years. The percentage of students with a PBE in public schools has remained consistently remained 2.6% to 2.7% lower than students in private schools. The percentage of students with PMEs has increased by .03% each year for the past three years (Figure 3). The percentage of students with PMEs in private schools has increased at a much faster rate compared with public schools over the past three years (Figure 3).

Figure 1: Percentage of California 7<sup>th</sup> Graders Completing the Pertussis Booster 2011-12 to 2013-14 School Years





Figure 4: Percentage of California 7<sup>th</sup> Graders with a PBE By School Type, 2011-12 to 2013-14 School Years
