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## 2012-2013 Child Care and School Fact Sheet

Thanks to universal enforcement of the California Immunization Law (Health and Safety Code, Sections 120325-120375 and California Code of Regulations, Sections 6000-6075) children in child care and schools are well protected against vaccine-preventable diseases. The implementation of statewide requirements has been effective in maintaining ≥92% immunization coverage among children in licensed child care facilities and kindergartens.
